BLANDING

Blanding, Utah has the unique distinction of being located in the very heart of San Juan County, one of the most picturesque, and diverse places in the world. Stay in **Blanding** a couple of days and visit all of Southeastern Utah from your "Base Camp To Adventure." If you just want to kick back and enjoy a peaceful day around **Blanding**, visit the Edge of the Cedars State Park and Museum, the Dinosaur Museum and Huck's Museum. Take a walking tour of San Juan County's historical roots at the Nations of the Four Corners and visit Pioneer, Spanish, Navajo and Ute homes as they were in the 1800's.

Enjoy the walking tour of **Blanding's** historic homes and buildings. Visit **Blanding's** famous trading posts, pottery shops, antique stores and the Ridgeway Art Gallery. Enjoy our restaurants and other amenities, and if you need to check your E-mail use the internet room at the **Blanding Visitor Center**. Each year the Edge of the Cedars State Park and Museum hosts the Four Corners Indian Art Market in May. The Museum also features many unique art displays, featuring local and regional artists, throughout the year. If you are so inclined, head out on one of our many ATV trails. Visit Recapture Reservoir (north of **Blanding** on Highway 191), for a little fishing and boating, or the

newly expanded 4th Reservoir (at the north end of Reservoir Road) for a little fishing.

Blanding also has a number of guided tour companies that can show you all the wonders of San Juan County on a 4-Wheeler, on horseback or from a tour bus. If trail riding is your bag of oats, San Juan County has some of the most scenic horse trails in the world. If you want to head out on your own, explore one or more of our scenic day trip routes. They feature excellent opportunities to hike, bike and explore the back country, or just see the area from your vehicle. If you like photography, you'll love these trips. The photo opportunities are endless

Want to see more of the country? From **Blanding**, visitors can travel north about 40 miles and enter Canyonlands National Park, or 81 miles to visit Arches National Park. 22 miles north is Monticello, home of the fabulous **Hideout Golf Club**, which was recently ranked as the Second Best public course in Utah by *Golf Week Magazine*. The **Hideout** is open seven days a week and no tee times are required to play this beautiful 18-hole golf course.

Seventy-three miles south of **Blanding** is world famous Monument Valley Tribal Park with its buttes, mesas, canyons and free-standing formations, which have been featured in

countless movies and television commercials. Along the way to Monument Valley, travelers can visit Valley of the Gods, Goose-necks State Park, Mexican Hat, and historic Bluff.

Visit Bluff's Historic District and see restored homes first constructed by the Mormon Pioneers, who came through the Hole-in-the-Rock trail. Tour the renovated Old Bluff Fort and see how the original settlers of Bluff lived. Bluff is home of the International Balloon Festival held every January, world-famous Twin Rocks Trading Post and Cafe and historic St. Christopher's Mission. West of **Blanding** you'll find Natural Bridges National Monument, Lake Powell National Recreation Area, Elk Ridge, Cottonwood Wash, Butler Wash Ruins and a number of scenic trails and sites.

East of **Blanding** is Hovenweep National Monument, Montezuma Canyon, Recapture Canyon and even more scenic wonders. Mesa Verde National Park, located near Cortez, Colorado, is only about 2 hours east of **Blanding**.

Cache Valley's Hidden Treasures

Cache is pronounced "cash" and is a French word that means "to hide or store one's treasure." You'll find plenty of hidden fortune

in this high mountain agricultural valley known for outdoor adventures, hands-on heritage experiences, and performing and fine arts. Mountain biking, canoeing, fly fishing, bird watching, hiking, rock climbing, skiing, snowshoeing, and snowmobiling are a few outdoor attractions.

Stop in at the American West Heritage Center, a 160-acre living-history center where you can experience firsthand the history of the Old West. Depending on the day, you'll visit with Native Americans, mountain men, farmers, and pioneers. They'll keep you busy living life like they did through games, activities, crafts, and food, music, wagon rides, and more. For a true taste of the area you'll enjoy the Cache Valley Food Tour where you can sample famous foods made in the area including cheeses, chocolates, coffee, cookies, honey, fruit, ice creams, and pastries.

The city of **Logan** is home to

Utah State University, a dozen art galleries and specialty shops, great examples of early Mormon pioneer architecture, and the stunning 1923 Ellen Eccles Theatre, home of the renowned Utah Festival Opera company and other nationally touring productions. Between **Logan** and Bear Lake you'll drive through dramatic mile-high limestone cliffs along the Logan Canyon National Scenic Byway, a 45-minute road trip through forested canopies along the winding Logan River.
